<b>Scheme of Question Paper</b>		

**Note: The question paper will carry a maximum of 40 marks.**

The paper will have seven questions as per details given below

Q. 1. The candidates will be asked to answer comprehension questions based on an extract from the text book. There will be internal choice. (5 marks)

The candidates will be asked to explain with reference to the context an extract from the text book. There will be internal choice. (3 marks)

There will be *four* short answer type questions based on the text book. The candidates will be asked to give answers in about 30 words each. There will be internal choice.

(2x3 = 6 marks)

There will be *one* essay type question based on the text book with internal choice. (6 marks)

Translation of a passage of about 10 sentences from Hindi to English (Non-Hindi speaking/foreign candidates will attempt a question of comprehension (with internal choice) based on an unseen passage in lieu of this question). (4 marks)

Paragraph (Candidates will be required to write about 250 words on any *one* out of the *five* given topics). (6 marks)

There will be *one* question with parts on the following items: common phrasal verbs, prepositions, common errors in English. (10 marks)
