Program Outcome(PO)

- To make the students to understand the concepts of Political Theory. It helps them to understand and distinguish between basic concepts like
- PO Political Theory, Political Thought and Political Philosophy. It also covers the concepts political realities of the different countries of the world and equip them to learn the basics of the of Political Science.

Program Specific Outcome(PSO)

- Knowledge of some of the philosophical underpinnings of modern politics and government and the legal principles by which political disputes are often settled are covered here. It also develops the ability to make logical
- PSO inferences about social and political issues on the basis of comparative and historical knowledge. Knowledge of key theories and concepts, historical developments, international organizations, and modern issues in international relations are studied here.

Course Outcomes

I Year Semester I

Paper-I: Western Political Thought

- It introduces the students to the Greek political traditions and specifically to the ideas of Plato and Aristotle. It also gives ideas of medieval and early modern political thinkers like Plato, Aristotle and Machiavelli. To
- CO familiarize the students with the exponents of the Social Contract Theory- Hobbes, Locke and Rousseau and also helps the students to develop and elaborate understanding of Marxian political thought. Student will also learn about ancient western political thinkers and their views on concept like ; state, democracy, monarchy, national state etc.

Paper-II: Indian Govt. and Politics –I

- This paper made to understand the philosophy of Indian Constitution, it focus in its evolution and examine the Preamble. It covers the salient features of Indian Constitution and the important institutions of the
- CO Indian Union like the Executive (President; Prime Minister, Council of Ministers; Governor, Chief Minister and Council of Ministers), The legislature(Rajya Sabha, Lok Sabha, Speaker, Committee System, State Legislature) , The Judiciary: (Supreme Court and the High Court) , Judicial Activism ..etc.

Paper-III: International Relation –Issues

- The students will get an overview about the nature, scope and evolution of international relations. It will help them to get acquainted with the
- CO basic ideas of international relations and familiarize them with the different approaches to the study of these subjects. It will also give them

a historical background of the discipline which will help them to understand international politics in a better way.

Paper-IV: Public administration –I

CO The paper will introduce the students to the basic concepts of Public Administration along with its basic principles and history. The paper also deals with the primary administrative theories and the basic principles of organization which will help the students to develop a comprehensive understanding of the subjects. It also helps to learn about structure of organization and their intricacies.

Paper-V: Research Methodology –I (option-I)

CO Students learn about the nature of social research , its uses in societies methodology of the social research and its scope

I Year Semester II

Paper-VI: Indian Political Thought

CO This paper covers the most prominent Indian Political Thinkers like Manu, Kautilya, Raja Ram Mohan Roy , M N Roy, Mahatma Gandhi, Jawaharlal Nehru, B R Ambedkar etc. The basic objective of the paper is to help the students to develop a comprehensive understanding of the basics of Indian political thought.

Paper-VII: Indian Govt. and Politics

CO Students to appreciate the various phases of Indian National Movement and also how is create value of the patriotism in them. It deals with the various Government of Indian Acts and also to understand the constitutional orderings and institutional arrangement. This paper identifies how electoral rules and procedure in India effect elections outcomes.

Paper-VIII: International Relation/Issues

CO To analyze the history of international relation and to learn causes and consequence of first world war and second world war. It also covers various ideologies and its influence on world politics. The concept of power, national, regional, global and peace security also covered by this paper. The students also study critically analyses the India bilateral relations with major power and neighboring countries.

Paper-IX: Public Administration

CO The students were made to understand the basics of personnel administration- both processes and institutions. It also covers the concepts of financial administration in the country with special reference to the process and principles of budgeting. The institutions for the reprisal of public grievances like; Lokpal, Lokayukta etc also covers this

paper.

Paper-X: Research methodology –II (option-I)

- CO Students learn about the Conceptualization of the research process, understanding of data analysis and its interpretation in relations to the research process. The study of research designs and its techniques, dimensions of conducting applied research is also taught to students.

II Year Semester III

Paper XI: Political Theory

- CO This paper covers the nature, scope and significance of political theory and the procedures of different theoretical ideas various traditional and modern theories of political science and theories of the origin of the state are also covered under this paper.

Paper XII: Comparative Politics

- CO The students are made to understand evolution of Comparative Politics as a discipline and drawing a distinction between Comparative Politics and Comparative Governments. Investigating the nature and scope of Comparative Politics is also covered in this paper.

Paper XIII: Indian Foreign Policy

- CO This is very interesting paper where students are able to apply ideological foundations of India's Foreign Policy and also analyze factors effecting it. It also to evaluate India's relations with other countries in Post-cold war era.

Paper XIV: International Law

- CO International Law paper covers the basics concepts and terminology of International law and distinguish amongst a variety of processes by which International Law is formed and roles played by the important bodies and institutions in evaluating International Legal System.

Paper XIV: International Organization & Global Studies

- CO Through this paper student knows about the historically background of international organization, role of League of Nations and UN. Comparison between League of Nations and UN their organs, structures and functions are also taught. Reason of failures and success of UN is an important aspect of this paper.

II Year Semester IV

Paper XVI: Political Theory - II

- CO Students in this paper studies democracy and theories like Elitist , Pluralist, Marxist etc., concept of development and its theories like Liberal, Marxist and Gandhi an sustainable development etc. and concept of Justice like distributive, justice, multiculturalism etc.

Paper XVII: Comparative politics - II

- CO This paper covers the Constitutions of the UK and the USA. The students are made to learn about The UK's constitution's salient features like their the executive - The Crown, Prime Minister and Cabinet, the legislature - House of Lords, House of Commons, Speaker, the judiciary, Party System in etc. and also USA's Constitution's: salient features like there the executive-President; the legislature - House of Senate. House of Representative; Speaker, the judiciary - the composition and role of the Supreme Court; Bill of Rights; Party System etc. Comparative analysis of the following institutions of UK and USA: like Legislature, Executive and party system also done here.

Paper XVIII: Indian Foreign Policy

- CO Students are able to evaluate ideological foundations of Indian Foreign Policy and also analyze influencing factors on it also covers India relation with its neighbors and challenges faced by it.

Paper XIX: International LAW

- CO International law paper Identifies the nature and the structure of the International Legal System and the procedure adopted for its implementation in practical contexts. The different sources of International Law its types and their procedure of implementation are also covered here.

Paper XX: International Organization & Global Studies

- CO In these paper students knows about the approaches of international organization and world system model of Marxian, Gandhi anand Rajni Kothari. Major international crisis like; Kashmir Iraq Arab etc. also covered in this paper.
